It's October and Fall should be definelty upon us. Pretty soon the leaves will begin to turn colors, pumpkins and other fall accents will spice up our décor and cooler temperatures will welcome us to best season of the year. Oh wait, about those cooler temperatures...

Well, while we wait for the 90s to become 60s, we will focus on other Fall activities such as National Bullying Prevention Month. In October, our school highlights the efforts in place to prevent bullying and cyber-bullying. Sem is proud to have some of the lowest bullying statistics in Frisco ISD.

This week, The Sem PTA hosted <u>Aim for Success</u> who presented to each of our grade levels on ways to prevent bullying.

K-2nd grade students experienced "Super Friends with Super Powers." They were trained on the following superpowers that will help prevent bullying at Sem:

- Being a Super friend to themselves by smiling and standing tall.
- It's never okay to be mean. Super Friends are never and never say mean words.
- Super Friends have to be a Super Friend to others by simply BEING NICE.
- Super Friends with super power defend others, but they don't fight.

Our 3rd-5th Grade became EMPOWERED! They learned:

- Students learned about PERSEPECTIVE and looking at the bigger picture of those have been bullied.
- Bullying effects girls and boys but it may look different. However, it still negatively impacts students emotionally, physically and mentally.
- Students gained a deeper understanding of CYBERBULLYING and the stronger and longer lasting effects it can have on others. Students were reminded that deleting images, texts and posts does not mean it's gone forever.
- There are many celebrities that have been bul-

lied such as Beyonce, Michael Phelps and Steve Jobs. Some of victims of bullying come out on top!

- Bullying incidents can be radically reduced if students become UPSTANDERS and report, rather than a bystander.
- Students learned how RADICAL ACTS of KINDNESS can have a great impact in our schools.

As school administrators, we take bullying seriously. If a bullying incident is reported by a student, teacher or family member, all parties, including witnesses, are investigated in order to come to a conclusion. Our teachers work hard to help students understand the difference between bullying and conflict. Classroom meetings and other efforts are in place to encourage kindness and build relationships within the classroom and school.

As parents, your support can help us beyond the school walls. The following ideas are recommended to help our efforts with bullying prevention:

- Discourage disrespect to others, including students and staff members.
- Discover differences by learning more about your neighbors.
- Encourage empathy which is a life long skill.
- Bring up UP-STANDERS and encourage them to defend, but not fight.
- Support radical acts of kindness that will help our school in a phenomenal way!

- 1. School starts at 7:45 am. and ends at 2:55 pm. Please, for the safety of your children, do leave them unattended.
- **2. Morning Drop Off:** You can use the front or back carpool entrance. Please do not block carpool. If your child walks to school, use the front entrance only.
- 3. **New Security System**: Please bring current ID every time you need to get into the building. You must place it close to the camera at the front door so that we can clearly see it. **This is a requirement for every person every time that you need to enter the school.**
- 4. You do not need to use the door bell to let us know when you are dropping off a lunch. Teachers check boxes 45 minutes before going to lunch.



5. **Lunch Visitors**: No lunch visitors until September 2nd. We need this time to teach our students our lunch time routines and expectations.



6. **Lunch and supplies drop off:** The boxes will be kept outside and teachers will check those boxes 45 minutes before lunch. If you are dropping off something that needs immediate attention, email your child's teacher. Remember, lunches will sit outside, so please pack them in containers

that will keep them at the appropriate temperature and protected from external conditions.

- 7. **Carpool**: Expect traffic and delays the first days of school. We have many new families that are not familiar with our routines.
- 8. **Cartags**: You need your cartag when you pick up your child. With your child's safety as our #1 concern, we will have to verify your identify before your child is released which will delay his/her dismissal.
- **9. After School Pick Up:** Front of school is for walkers only. The parking is for school busses and daycare centers only. No parent parking.

Attendance 101

Notification of Absence

FISD requires written documentation whenever a student is absent. <u>Calling the office does not excuse an absence</u>. Please go to Sem Elementary School website http://schools.friscoisd.org/campus/elementary/sem/ home and at the top righthand corner report your student's absence, please do not email teachers any absences.



Illness

A parent note/email or doctor's note is required to excuse the absence. Notes/emails must be received by the office within 3 school days of the absence. **Only 8 parent notes allowed a school year**. *If a student is absent due to illness for more than 4 consecutive days, a doctor's note is required to excuse the remaining days of the illness.*

Doctor's Appointment

Students who miss part or all of a day due to a doctor's appointment must bring a doctor's note to excuse the time away from school. Parent notes/emails cannot excuse a doctor's appointment. A doctor's appointment with a note is <u>not</u> considered a tardy.

Tardies

Parent notes cannot excuse a tardy. A student is considered tardy if they check in before 10am. If they check in after 10 am, the student will be marked unexcused absent unless a doctor's note is provided.

90 Percent Rule

Students who miss more than **18** full days of school in a single school year must have approval from a campus committee to be promoted to the next grade.

Late pickup-students not picked up by 2:55 dismissal

Bringing Items to School

To protect our instructional time from interruptions, please leave all drop-off items in the grade level bins outside the front office with students first and last name on item. Teachers automatically check the bins on the way to lunch. If your child needs an item before lunch, notify the front office and they will inform the teachers.



No Pets on Campus

It is an FISD policy that pets are not to be brought on school campus our grounds at any time during the school day by parents or employees.

Dress Code

For safety concerns, tennis shoes must be worn during physical education class. Flip-Flops will not be worn in P.E.

PLEASE label your child's jacket, coat, scarf, mittens, lunch box, back pack, etc. with their FIRST and LAST name.




The district also prohibits any clothing or grooming that, in the principal's judgment, may reasonably be expected to cause disruption of or interference with normal operations.


